**The End of 3rd Quarter** is April 2. Report cards will be sent home the following week. There will be **no school** on April 3 for Good Friday.

**Standardized Testing is April 9-10.** Please do not schedule any appointments for your child on these dates so they can complete their testing. Students may bring in a healthy snack to eat during a morning break on these days.

**Hot Lunch:** Our April Hot Lunch will be on Friday, April 17 at 12:00pm. We will send out a signup sheet later this month for that meal's ingredients. The cost for hot lunch is \$3 per adult and \$2 per child.

**ReEnrollment:** If you plan to return next year, please re-enroll your child before April 30<sup>th</sup> to take advantage of the discounted Enrollment Fee of \$75 per child. To Re-enroll, the form and fee must be turned in together. After April 30<sup>th</sup>, the cost is \$150 per child. Enrolling early is a great help to us as we prepare for next school year.
