**Spirit Week:** Each day during the week of March 2-6, students may dress up according to the day's theme.

Please turn in the form and fee together to re-enroll. After April 30<sup>th</sup>, the cost is \$150 per child. Please discuss your plans for the fall, and be prepared to re-enroll your child. This helps us with planning for next school year.

### Looking Ahead...

**The End of 3rd Quarter** is April 2. Report cards will be sent home the following week. There will be **no school** on April 3 for Good Friday.

**Standardized Testing is April 9-10th.** Please do not schedule any appointments for your child on these dates so they can complete their testing.

**Enrollment for new students will open on April 1<sup>st</sup>.** Please spread the word about GRCA to your family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, etc. For each family that enrolls because of your referral, you'll receive a \$50 credit toward your tuition account!

### ***Christian Education's Three-Legged Stool***
